Sewing Pottery Class



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Class Description

Sewing Pottery is the creation of a vase made from fabric-covered coiled cotton clothesline.

Project

Students will make a coiled vase or bowl in class

Duration

1/2 day workshop

Skills to learn in class

The students will learn how to use fabric and clothesline to create a vase or bowl.

- Preparing of and mechanics for covering cotton clothesline with fabric strips
- How to start a base of bowl/vase, and create sides of the vase.
- How to create top or lip of vase
- How to assemble pieces of the vase together
- Embellishment options

Supply list

- Sewing machine that will do a zig-zag stitch. Featherweights will not work for this technique
- Open toe foot / open toe appliqué foot
- Jeans/denim needle, size 100
- Thread to match fabric
- Extra bobbins
- Straight pins
- Clothesline / Rope. MUST be 100% cotton with no plastic center (a plastic core will break needles on your machine)
- Fabric strips cut approximately 3/4 inch wide (can be wider depending on the desired look)
- Washable school glue stick (the purple kind)
- Optional: Yarn for embellishment
